Since I last wrote, Chevrolet has discontinued production of the 2020 c8 coupe and began filling orders for the 2020 convertible.

I was contacted by a dealer representative in early June to confirm I still wanted the car. I think my answer was something like, "Hell yeah." Then in mid-July my salesman informed me about the cancelation of the 2020 and that I needed to come in and redo all the paperwork to place an order for a 2021 model.

Bad news...I have to wait a few more months. Good news...researching internet comments from initial 2020 c8 owners I was able to fine-tune my selections a bit. As a result I moved to the 2LT version and added the front end lift system.

Obviously, I can't wait to take delivery. According to the salesman I didn't lose my place in line. I haven't seen any production numbers, but I believe Chevrolet produced about half the 2020 models which were pre-ordered.

Hopefully, they will call me on Christmas Eve with good news and climate change will see us with sunny and warm December/January days. Not holding my breath though. I can't wait to show all you (or you-all if you prefer) fellow club members a 2021 c8!

How Pratt & Miller Made the Ultimate C6 Corvette With an 8.2-Liter V8

In presenting its first C6RS at SEMA, Pratt & Miller unleashed a 500ci Corvette with 600 horsepower and 650 pound-feet of torque long before GM could reveal its first "Blue Devil" ZR1, a flagship that came with a supercharged LS9 producing 638 horsepower and 604 pound-feet of torque. Yet massive linear power wasn't the only trick up Pratt & Miller's sleeve.

Corvette Racing:

After going 1st and 2nd on August 2nd at Road America, on August 23rd Antonio Garcia and Jordan Taylor drove the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R to victory in the Michelin GT Challenge at Virginia International Raceway.

It's the second win in a row for the Garcia/Taylor combo, their third of the season and the fourth consecutive win for Corvette Racing – the first time that's happened for the team since 2014. Garcia and Taylor extended their lead in the GT Le Mans (GTLM) Driver's Championship, as did Chevrolet in the Manufacturer's standings.

Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner placed fourth in the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Corvette C8.R, just missing making the podium again with their teammates. The result was enough to keep Gavin and Milner third in GTLM points heading to Michelin Raceway Road Atlanta in two **weeks**.
